- Identify the lifetime risk associated with metabolic syndrome in pregnancy
Discuss with patients the lifetime risk of metabolic syndrome
- Define pharmacologic properties of tranexamic acid
- Identify outcomes of studies exploring the use of tranexamic acid for prevention and for treatment of postpartum hemorrhage Identify possible clinical applications of tranexamic acid in obstetrics
- Identify the fundamental changes in Washington State Law regarding paid surrogate arrangements
- Understand the difference between genetic and gestational surrogacy arrangements and how that may impact your patients
- Identify some of the complex legal, ethical, and social issues involved in surrogacy so that you can anticipate some of the situations your practice could face
- Discuss the advantage of cell-free DNA Prenatal aneuploidy screening
- Recognize the challenges of detecting fetal aneuploidy from maternal cell-free DNA List common causes of false negative and false positive cfDNA screening results
- Describe secondary or incidental finding that may arise from cell-free DNA prenatal aneuploidy screening
- Identify the pharmacologic options available for management of GDM
- Discuss the recommendations from both the ACOG and SMFM
- Identify appropriate blood sugar targets for GDM management
- Discuss the epidemiology of the opioid epidemic in pregnant women
- Discuss the maternal, fetal, and neonatal risks of opioid use in pregnancy
- Identify considerations for the utilization of opioids for management of postpartum pain in the opioid-naïve patient
